For the first time ever, the full picture of North Marston's past has been pieced together. 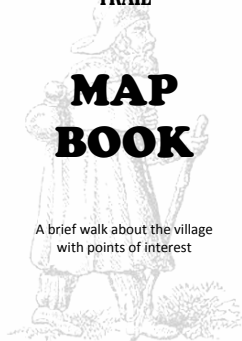

Compiled by Club Chairman John Spargo and set to medieval music, this unique collection of images of human and grotesque mythical creatures reflect a time when gifts and bequests to John Schorne’s shrine made St Mary’s one of the wealthiest parish churches in England, and able to afford this hugely expensive decorative masonry.




The book, which spans 72 pages, describes the event, the crew, the plane and the training of night bomber crews in wartime Britain. 	<p>Six Young Lives DVD: A ten-minute DVD capturing the essence of the day of the unveiling of the memorial plaque to the crew of HE740 who died when their plane crashed in the village on 4th January 1945.</p>	<p>The DVD costs £5.00 and can be bought through this website.</p>
	<p>Summer Fete DVDs: scanned and colour-corrected from 8mm cine film, these discs are a compilation of fetes from the early 1960s until the early 1980s that can be watched on a home TV.
