21st June 1845: *“ Mr Bull today shipped off a lot of emigrants for Quebec; they were mostly from villages around Aylesbury, and of a respectable class of labourer.”*

2nd September 1871: *“A remarkable cure of a woman of the name of Webb, a pauper on the Wycombe Union, has been made. She had been bed-ridden 23 years at her own house, and chargeable all that time. Further out-door relief was refused, and she was removed to the (work)house. Not liking her new home, she got up and walked four miles back to her house at Prestwood. So her cure was complete.”*

June 7th 1843: *“Two men broke out of Aylesbury Gaol and got clear away.”*

June 17th 1843: *“The two prisoners have been brought back to Aylesbury Gaol; the father of one brought his son, and claimed the reward for so doing.”*
