Tenth Anniversary of "The North Marston Story

Since its publication in 2014, 540 copies of The North Marston Story have been sold. As most of you know, it is a very extensive illustrated history of this village running to 430 pages and is still available to buy in the Shop or from any History Club Committee member. It is one of many achievements of the History Club since its foundation in 2010. Throughout those years our other activities include: the publishing of Memories Shared and Six Young Lives along with numerous other booklets; the setting up of the Heritage Trail and Heritage Markers: the installation of the Bomber Memorial in the church; a wide range of talks by outside speakers; the obtaining of grants including help towards the refurbishment of the Wesley Centre; talks by us to local societies and the

village school; and numerous visits to places of historical interest. We are also approached by relatives of former residents of the village trying to trace their family tree. We are now focusing on the renovation of the Parish Barn.

Remembrance Sunday 10th November 2024

This year there will be an extra special Remembrance Service as we are celebrating the 100th anniversary of the Opening of the Memorial Hall by unveiling two new bronze plaques commemorating the men who died for this country in the First and Second World Wars and in the Malayan Conflict. The unveiling will take place on Remembrance Sunday during the usual service at the Memorial Hall and will be accompanied by an exhibition in the Schorne Room and the sale of the book *Six Young Lives* about the airmen killed in the village in 1945.

AGM 2025

Our AGM will be held at the Wesley Centre on Tuesday 21st January at 7.30pm. After the brief business meeting, John Spargo will be showing his film "The Regicide Cornelius Holland" which looks at the man from Granborough who not only signed the death warrant for King Charles the First but who was also responsible for the destruction of local churches. So, please put this date in your diary for next year (or better still on your History Club 2025 calendar!)
