This year we have held some very interesting open evenings with talks on Bomber Command, The Black Death, Amersham in World War Two and Schooling in Winslow since 1314. John Spargo gave a talk and tour of the village to Year 3 & 4 pupils from North Marston School highlighting the sites of former village shops, post offices, pubs and significant traders from the days when the village was largely selfsufficient. Through enquiries on our website the club has also continued to help people research their ancestors. We are currently helping to find information on the 17th century Saunders family whose memorials feature on the walls of the church.

Events for the Future

We have one talk left this year to be given by an outside speaker. This is entitled "The Royal Bucks Hospital" by John Flewin who is back by popular demand. John gave this presentation to us last year and it was very much enjoyed. So, if you missed it do come along! It comes highly recommended. Our schedule of talks for 2026 is currently being finalised. 
2026 Calendar

Operation Pilgrim



A chance discovery of medieval floor tiles, a previously hidden section of a medieval shrine and Latin graffiti high up on the chancel arch combined to solve the answer to a question from the late 15th century. Ancient buildings

like North Marston's St Mary's church reveal their secrets slowly and only after a lot of attention to detail. It is therefore something to be celebrated when the answer to a six hundred year-old puzzle comes to light. John Spargo has pieced together the clues and reveals all in his booklet "Operation Pilgrim" that is available from the church or from the History Club (https://northmarstonhistory.org.uk/) for £4.00.
